Glass Design

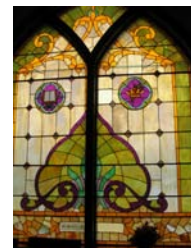
C. Z. Lawrence and James Piercey

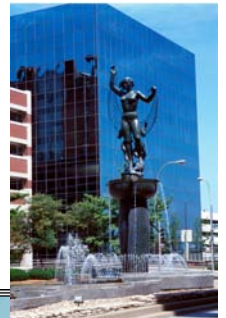

But it's not only the number of fountains that makes Kansas City the City of Fountains, but the craftsmanship and presentation of these celebrations of water. Spending a day leisurely touring these stunning structures adds to the Kansas City experience.



New Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts



The **Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts**, a new center for music, opera, theater, and dance, opened in downtown Kansas City, September 2011. What began as a sketch on a napkin has become an architectural icon and home for the performing arts in Kansas City. The Kauffman Center is one of the most technically and architecturally advanced performing arts centers in the nation. Designed by Moshe Safdie, the 285,000-square-foot facility includes two stand-alone halls—the 1,800-seat Muriel Kauffman Theatre and the 1,600-seat Helzberg Hall—both housed

within a dramatic overarching shell featuring a glass roof and walls providing sweeping views of Kansas City.

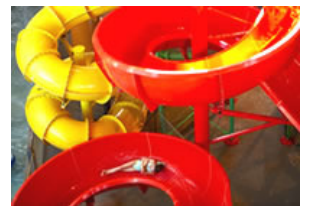
