International Conferences

Lisbon, Spain - September 26 - 28, The Portuguese Committee of the Corpus Vitrearum will present "Stained Glass After 1920: Technology and Conservation." Twentieth and early twenty-first century stained glass present particular technical features that are related to changing aesthetics. New technology and materials also represent a great challenge to conservators and conservation scientists. These aspects have not yet been the object of systematic reflection in spite of some important contributions. The next forum intends to propose an overall approach to this subject and motivate related discussion. Art historical issues are central to the desired theoretical and methodological debate to be engaged in this forum as well as an integrated vision of artistic production in the considered period. Workshops are a specific aspect of contemporary stained glass heritage which deserve particular attention.

Papers will be offered in English, French, and German. Simultaneous translation will not be provided at the conference.




